## The Pink Book

The Pink Book provides physicians, nurses, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, pharmacists, and other healthcare professionals with the most comprehensive **information on vaccine-preventable diseases**.

Typical chapters include a description of the disease, pathogenesis, clinical features, laboratory diagnosis, medical management epidemiology, risk factors, trends in the United States, vaccine details, vaccination schedule and use, contraindications and precautions to vaccination, adverse reactions following vaccination, vaccine storage and handling, and reference or publications.

The appendices are a wealth of reference materials including: minimum age and interval table, current and discontinued vaccines, ingredients tables and vaccine administration guide.

## The Yellow Book

The Yellow Book is published every two years by CDC as a reference for those who **advise international travelers about health risks**. It is written primarily for healthcare professionals.

## The Guide to Community Preventive Services

The Guide to Community Preventive Services is a free resource to help you choose programs and policies to **improve health and prevent disease in your community**. Systematic reviews are used to answer these questions: Which program and policy interventions have been proven effective? Are there effective interventions that are right for my community? What might effective interventions cost? What is the likely return on investment?

## The Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report

The Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report (MMWR) series is prepared by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Often called “the voice of CDC,” the MMWR series is the agency’s primary vehicle for **scientific publication** of timely, reliable, authoritative, accurate, objective, and useful public health information and recommendations.

MMWR readership predominantly consists of physicians, nurses, public health practitioners, epidemiologists, and other scientists, researchers, educators, and laboratorians.

The data in the weekly MMWR is provisional, and is based on weekly reports to CDC by state health departments.

# How to Access CDC Resources in STAT!Ref

1. Log in to STAT!Ref as you normally do.

2. Type in a search term.

3. When the search results appear, applicable CDC Resources will appear in the left hand column under "Additional Resources" (A).
