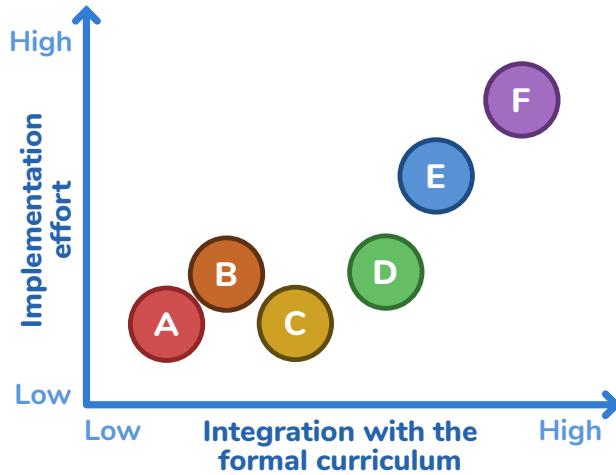




# Using Osmosis to Support Teaching and Learning

Letter	Strategy	Description
<b>A</b>	<b>Active, Self-Directed Learning for Students</b>	Encourage student use of Osmosis videos, flashcards, and MCQs as they move through your curriculum.
<b>B</b>	<b>Library Resource for Health Professions Students</b>	Provide high-quality supplemental resources to all of the students that you support as a librarian; Osmosis will train you as a platform expert so you can train your students and recommend content to supplement their coursework, in addition to supporting students who need additional help.
<b>C</b>	<b>Formative Assessment &amp; Student Performance Tracking</b>	Track students’ use of Osmosis videos, flashcards, and MCQs as they move through your curriculum and monitor their performance on low-stakes assessments (including accuracy of first attempt vs. latest attempt).
<b>D</b>	<b>Support for At-Risk &amp; Remediation Students</b>	Develop a custom study plan to support students who need additional academic support and/or prescriptive plans for those that need remediation.
<b>E</b>	<b>Curricular Supplement for Students</b>	Direct students to specific Osmosis videos and assessment items which best fit in the curriculum.
<b>F</b>	<b>Flipped Classroom &amp; Blended Learning</b>	Recommend/assign curated Osmosis videos and corresponding assessment items, and give students participation points for engagement with Osmosis resources.
